PHASE I: PRE-CONSTRUCTION

This level of the Apprenticeship Program will allow the participant to gain experience communicating and coordinating with the Owner and Design Team through the design and bidding phase of the project. Through the Pre-Construction Phase of a project, the apprentice will work closely with the RAAM Team to produce a detailed **Cost Estimate**, along with **Project Qualifications** based on the subcontractor proposals obtained in the **Bidding Process**. Overall, the Pre-Construction Level of the Apprenticeship Program will allow the participant to gain experience and knowledge on the following:

- Blueprint reading skills from Architectural, Structural, Civil, Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing, and Landscape plans through *Plan Reviews*
- Prepare and issue bid instructions to Subcontractors, along with coordination efforts to obtain proposals through *Procore Bid Management*
- Participate with the review of potential design conflicts, value engineering practices, coordination of construction means & methods, and budgetary cost impacts through **Pre-Construction Meetings** with the Developers and the Design Team

Learn about the various construction contracts such as lump-sum, time & material, costplus and guaranteed max price contracts through participating in *Contracting Procedures*

PHASE II: CONSTRUCTION

This level of the Apprenticeship Program will allow the participant to gain experience in mobilizing projects, coordination with the various subcontractors, and coordination of all construction activity. Through the Construction Phase of a project, the apprentice will work closely with the Project Superintendent and RAAM Team as the project progresses from *Mobilization* to *Closeout*, depending on the project's schedule and apprentice time frame. Overall, the Construction Level of the Apprenticeship Program will allow the participant to gain experience and knowledge on the following:

- Assist with the coordination of work for our Self-Performed Trades, including excavation, grading, framing, drywall, and painting
- Coordinate and, on occasion, lead Weekly Foreman's Meetings to help maintain sufficient progress on the project
- Attend and participate in the weekly OAC Meetings among RAAM Team, Ownership and Architects
- Through using Procore and other software, coordinate and communicate with the Project Team via RFIs, Submittals, Lookahead Schedules, Daily Logs, Quality Control, Change Orders and Punch Lists

PHASE III: OFFICE OPERATIONS

This level of the Apprenticeship Program will allow the participant to gain experience in project financing, subcontractor contracts and invoices, and – when applicable – prevailing wage coordination. Specific to RAAM Construction, all financing and subcontractor buyout is performed at our main office rather than on–site. We believe that with our Field Operations team focusing on the construction of the project and our Office Operations team focusing on the project financing and subcontractor buyout, our projects can operate smoothly and efficiently compared to others. Overall, the Office & Finance Operations Level of the Apprenticeship Program will allow the participant to gain experience and knowledge on the following:

- Prepare and present Payment Applications and Draw Requests for multiple projects
- Participate in the coordination and discussions of Awarding Subcontracts
- Review subcontractor's proposals and insurances to create and issues subcontractors as part of the *Subcontractor Buyout* for various projects
- Review Subcontractor & Vendor Invoices and provide recommendations for payment
- Coordinate with the Field Team to prepare and issue Change Order Requests and Change Orders
- Verify **Subcontractor Payment Applications** for percent completion
- (When Applicable) Coordinate with the Field Team to ensure projects are fully compliant with *Prevailing Wage Requirements*
